Born and raised in Nashville, he graduated from Cumberland High School in 1954, excelling in sports and many activities. He married his high school sweetheart, Mary Ann Walker (d 1976) with whom they had a son Kerry. In 1978, he married Jennie Davis (d 2009).

He was a familiar face in downtown Nashville as owner of Capital Window Cleaning Company (started in 1933 by his father) serving the majority of business from skyscrapers to storefronts, hotels to homes.

During his lifetime he was active in many organizations: Past President of Nashville Area Beekeepers, Tennessee Beekeepers, Tennessee Chapter of Nashville Scleroderma Foundation, and the Bordeaux Lions Club.

He worked tirelessly supporting causes he believed in. Active in several hobbies he enjoyed gardening, hunting, fishing, sign painting, drawing, wood carving, blacksmithing, pigeon racing, log houses, and the TN/KY Thresherman group.

Always eager to lend a hand to tackle any size project, he truly had an amazing wealth of knowledge. Known for his sense of humor, he had an ability to weave a story and have you in tears from laughter.
