Tyler John Smith, age 31, was freed from the chains of addiction by his Lord on April 14, 2021. Tyler was born on December 14, 1989, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. For the last 12 years, he was quite the nomad—living in Indiana, Alabama, Colorado and Florida and, most recently, making Nashville his home.

He is survived by his parents, John Smith, and Danita and Del McCartney; grandmother, Delphine Neely; sister and brother-in-law, Meghan and Cole Graham; niece, Eden; uncles Dave and Darren; aunts Jen and Debbie; cousins Annie, Aidan, Owen and Tate; his girlfriend Katie Plum; and a host of friends. Tyler was preceded in death by his grandfather, Donald “Duke” Neely, whom he dearly loved.

Many knew Tyler only through the lens of the addiction he battled for years, but that was not the real Tyler. For those fortunate enough to truly know and love him, we will remember him as a baby with beautiful golden curls, a great soccer athlete, an amazing cook, a lover of the mountains, a hard worker, a fiercely loyal friend and someone who called often and ended every conversation with “love you.”

The chains of addiction that bound him were stronger than anything he could battle on his own. He fought that addiction for 12 years and genuinely sought God's help during the struggle. Tyler spent the last month of his life ensuring that those he loved knew it. He reconciled with family even though he had no need to, and he was optimistic about a new life, his new job and an exciting future.

He is now living his new life and, though it is not the one he or those who love him envisioned, it is far better than anything we could imagine and is eternal. Tyler is now happy, healthy and whole, and we are comforted and strengthened to know we will be with him again one day.

Family and friends are invited to a memorial honoring Tyler's life on Saturday, May 15, at noon at Lakeshore Park's Marble Hall, located on Orchard Drive, Knoxville 37919. While

the venue is covered, seating is limited, so please bring a lawn chair with you.
