



Andrea Morrison Baker

June 21, 1973 - September 5, 2010

Age 37, of Nashville passed away suddenly on Sept. 5, 2010. Survived by her husband of 4 years, Kenneth Baker; parents Bob and Barbara Morrison; sister Wendy Morrison; niece Emma Kussrow; mother-in-law Geraldine R. Baker; brothers-in-law: The Reverend Kevin Baker (Denise) and Keith Baker (Joy). Andrea started swimming at the age of 6 at the Nashville Aquatic Club and swam for Brentwood High, eventually going to the University of Georgia where she swam on a NCAA championship 200-free relay team. The hard work and dedication required of the sport of swimming carried over to her life after college. Taking additional degrees in counseling, she became the counselor at Eakin School in 2001, where she stayed for 9 years. She was the president of the Middle Tennessee Counselor Association from 2004-2007. She was the recipient of the Leadership Award at the Argosy University Graduation in 2008. She was responsible for starting the school garden program at Eakin and in 2010 was one of the two finalists for Metro Nashville's Teacher Of The Year. Andrea was beautiful, generous, believed in the truth and was beloved by everyone she touched- friends, students, her co-workers and most of all her family. She accomplished more in her all-too-brief life than many do blessed with a lot more time. She had a wonderfully quirky sense of humor, but could be completely professional when the occasion demanded. She will be terribly missed. She was sensitive and loving, a great kid. I know.
