



## Charlie Ray Green

July 27, 1958 - December 12, 2024

Charles Ray Green, 66, of Tellico Plains, TN, died Thursday, December 12, 2024. He was enjoying one of his favorite pastimes—hunting and communing with nature—when the Lord unexpectedly called him home.

Charlie was born in Oak Ridge, TN, on July 27, 1958, to Charles Ellis Green and Guyda Ann Stokes Green. Upon completing high school, he proudly served in the United States Navy as a Systems Aircraft O.M. Technician at NAS Miramar, San Diego, CA. After his time in the Navy, he continued his career at Thomas & Betts and ABB as an electrician technician.

Charlie had a wonderful sense of humor and found many moments to laugh. He loved hunting and the outdoors. He always had a book (or three) in hand. He adored dogs and music, especially Stevie Ray Vaughan. A faithful disciple of God, he enjoyed working with the young men and primary children of his local congregation at The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Most of all, he loved his family.

He is survived by his mother, Guyda McGregor; stepmother, Phyllis Green; his wife of 12 years, Cheryl Ann Davis Green; sister, Kahra Gilley (Johnny); stepbrother, Kent McGregor (Teri); and many nieces and nephews. Charlie leaves a family legacy any man would be proud to call his own. Together with his first spouse, Valerie McCurry ("Mac"), Charlie brought four children into the world with love: son Dustin Green (Jessica), daughter Misty Green Cresswell,

Charles was preceded in death by his father, Charles “Shane” Ellis Green, and stepfather, Bill McGregor.
