Leinbach, M.D., COL U.S. Army (Retired) Conwell

Died of a brain tumor on Nov 12, 2011. He is survived by his family: Sharon his wife of 38 years; his sons Marc Leinbach of Chicago IL, CPT Christopher Leinbach of Ft. Campbell, KY, and Dane Leinbach of Jonesboro AR; his daughters Kira Bauer of Sarasota FL, and Dr. Grace Coggio of River falls WI; seven grandchildren; Tessa, Dana, and Ellen Coggio, Nathan and Brian Bauer, Kylie and Joaquin Leinbach and two nieces, Kristen Kennedy and Lorry Izor of Los Angeles CA. After graduating from West Point in 1961, COL Leinbach served the U.S. Army in a variety of staff and command assignments during both peace and war. He initially served as a Military Intelligence Officer then, after a break in service to attend Temple Medical School, as an Army physician. His military honors include 2 Legions of Merit, 2 Bronze Stars, 4 Meritorious Service Medals, the Air Medal, the Vietnam Service Medal, and the Order of Military Medical Merit. COL Leinbach will be inurned with full military honors in the Arlington National Cemetery at 12:30 PM on March 2, 2012.
