DENTON, Dolores Ann (Whaley) June 19, 1940 - March 27, 2010. Known as "Ann" to her family, friends, and colleagues at Blossom Hill Elementary School in Los Gatos and as Miss Whaley and, later, Mrs. Denton to her students. Ann Denton inspired hundreds of Los Gatos students in a teaching career that spanned from 1963 to 2003. Daughter of John and Frances Whaley of Jamestown, California, she graduated from the Calaveras High School at San Andreas, California in 1958. After attending the University of the Pacific for one year she transferred to San Jose State College where she graduated in 1963 with a BA degree and teaching credential in elementary education. Later, she earned her Masters degree in elementary education. She began her teaching career in the Fall of 1963 at Blossom Hill Elementary School where she taught for the next forty years. Not having a car at the beginning of her career, she rode the bus from her residence in downtown San Jose exiting at the corner where the Paul Swanson Ford agency was located then walking the distance to Blossom Hill School. Later in 1965 she bought a new Ford Mustang convertible at the Swanson agency and put her bus riding days behind her. Characterized by her optimism, Ann loved teaching, was proud of her profession, and always strove to bring dignity, fairness, creativity, and relevance to her classroom. Surrounded by loving care, she died peacefully in her home in Cottontown, Tennessee from complications associated with Pick's disease. She is survived by her husband Donald, their three sons and daughter-in-laws; Robert and Nancy Denton,

Chris and Brenda Denton, David and Lori Denton, eight grandchildren, three great grandchildren, and by her brother and sister-in-law John and Debra Whaley. All who knew her will miss her.
