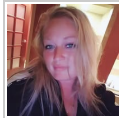

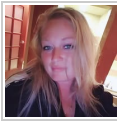
Please do not continue to go back and forth with one another out of respect for Eddie (boo-boo) and please leave Lynda be. Thanks!
