WARDELL, Eugene "Gene", 90, passed away August 18, 2018 and was born January 16, 1928 in Sevier County Tennessee, raised and spent his early life in Knoxville and Oak Ridge, Tennessee, attending Knoxville High School and University of Tennessee. Gene also worked a number of years doing art work in Oak Ridge and Knoxville. Gene spent most of his working years as a salesman traveling regionally. Later, Gene moved to Nashville, TN, where he married Ruth Holt Pippin. He was an active member at First Church of the Nazarene in Nashville, where he enjoyed the Sunday School Group, Choir and Gideon's. He is also survived by grandchildren: Sam Wardell (Amy) & Betty (Sarah) King (Jeff) with great-granddaughter, Sloane; Seth Wardell (Gina) with great-grandchildren (Ella and Eston), Jonathan Wardell (Bryony), Benjamin Wardell (Crystal) with great-grandson Landon; and step grandsons Adam Grey (Blair) and Paul Grey. With Ruth Pippin he had four grown step children: Bettie MacCaskill (Mack), with three step grandchildren, Tammy, Jimmy (Lisa), and Donna; Carl Pippin (Joyce) with grown daughters Carla and Carol;
