WEININGER, Hanna Mansbach age 94, died August 8, 2013 in a suburb of Nashville, TN. Hanna, the eldest of six children, was born January 22, 1919 in Ashland, Kentucky to Joseph and Sylvia Mansbach. Hanna lived in the Scottsdale, Arizona area for over 30 years, beginning in 1971. She enjoyed European travel, favoring Italy the most. Hanna's diction and grammar were perfect; she had a hobby of correcting television announcers when they did not live up to her standards.

While in Scottsdale, she was a great patron and collector of the arts and supported young and established artists. She was awarded by the recording industry for providing recordings of the "great books" for the School of the Blind. Hanna was very active in civil affairs and politics in Scottsdale. She traveled to Nashville and proudly held the bible during the 1998 swearing in of her eldest daughter, Judge Carol Soloman, which was conducted by Judge Frank Clement.

Hanna was predeceased by her parents Joseph and Sylvia Mansbach, her brother Sam Mansbach, her sister Minx Auerbach, her sister Trudy Weber; and her husband Harold Weininger. She is survived by her brother Jerry Mansbach (Annie) of Ashland, Kentucky; sister Soph Pockros Levinson (Joe) of Cincinnati, Ohio; her daughter Judge Carol Soloman (James Berry) of Goodlettsville, Tennessee; her daughter Jane Soloman of Phoenix, Arizona; and her son Richard Soloman of Alden, North Carolina; four grandchildren – Todd (Kelly), Ambra (Ada), John, and Joshua Offutt (of Goodlettsville,
