Delaney, James Leonard. Age 84 (February 24, 2015). Native of Nashville. Preceded in death by father, James Clarence Delaney; Mother, Julia Agnes Farmer; and sister, Betty Jean Conyer. For six years, he was the husband of Charlene B. Appleton; there were no children. He leaves next-of-kin survivors Robert S. Delaney, Roanoke, VA, and Mildred Ragan, Nashville. His lifetime exposure to the nation was broad, having had a post office address in 38 of the 48 contiguous states. A graduate of East High School, he held degrees from the Universities of Montana and Oklahoma. Under Eugene Odum, University of Georgia, he studied Ecology, Behavior and Population Dynamics which produced an early-on liaison with the Population Institute, Washington, D.C. As a Fishery Research Biologist, he served with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Texas) and the Bureau of Commercial Fisheries (Connecticut). His 30-year Air Force career began with the Korean War in 1951. Commissioned in 1954, he served with the Strategic Air Command (SAC), Air National Guard Flying Units in New York and Tennessee before beginning a nine-year Pentagon assignment. He attended the National War College, Washington, D.C. and graduated as a resident from the Air War College, Montgomery, AL. For 40 years, his chief avocation was owning, maintaining, and flying antique and yesteryear aircraft – most recently, from Fall Creek Airfield in south Wilson County. He was a member of the American Fisheries Society, Toastmasters International (since 1970), The Retired Officers Association (life), Veterans of Foreign Wars (life), Federation of Americans for Immigration

Reform (FAIR), and American Immigration Control. Survivors and friends request that memorial contributions be sent to Room at the Inn.
