



Jimmy Wayne Brewington Sr

September 27, 1949 - November 11, 2023

LCpl (Retired) Jimmy W. Brewington, Sr., 74, of Mount Juliet, passed away unexpectedly on Saturday, November 11, 2023.

Born September 27, 1949, Brewington was a proud veteran of the United States Marine Corps, enlisting May 14, 1968. He advanced to the rank of Lance Corporal and was assigned to India Company, 3rd Battalion, 7th Regiment, 1st Marine Division. Among his many awards, Brewington earned the Vietnam Cross of Gallantry with Palm medal for heroic conduct while in combat with the enemy and the Purple Heart for wounds received in combat in the Republic of Vietnam. He retired from the Corps in 1971.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Rebecca C. Brewington; Parents, Robert and Glenda Brewington; And brother, Danny Brewington.

Brewington is survived by son, Jimmy W. Brewington, Jr.; Daughters, Jennifer (Mike) Evancho and Jada Craft; Grandsons, Zachary Jett and Christopher Evancho; Uncle, Jerry (Glenda) Brewington; Sister, Doris Peek; Nephew, Jason (Daisy) Tinsley; And many beloved cousins.

Brewington and his wife, Rebecca, will be interred at Middle Tennessee State Veterans Cemetery on Thursday, November 30th at 1pm.
