



John "Johnny" C. Beasley

John (Johnny) Carroll Beasley, age 69, of Murfreesboro and formerly of Milton, passed away February 4, 2014 after a lengthy illness. A native of Nashville, he was the son of Jordan Vance Beasley, Jr. and Madaline Nabors Beasley. He graduated from East High School in 1963 where he was an outstanding member of the football team, having been the first freshman in East High history to start for the varsity. He retired as a Metro/Nashville firefighter with 35 years of service where he was known as "Honest John". Johnny will be remembered fondly by his family and friends for his winning personality, athleticism and strength, and his love of cars, trucks, motorcycles, and tractors. He was a member of Stones River Regional and Middle Tennessee Region Antique Automobile Car Clubs and Middle Tennessee Chapter of Studebaker Drivers Club.
