"Coach" Jon Lawrence Hazelip, 79, was officially pronounced in heaven at 8:06PM March 4, 2019 in Nashville, Tennessee, surrounded by his family. Jon was born November 2, 1939 to Lawrence and Barbara Hazelip in Youngstown, Ohio.

Jon was married to the love of his life, Carolyn Weaver Hazelip, for 60 years. He loved his career coaching basketball at Georgia Christian High School in Dasher, Georgia and Alabama Christian College in Montgomery, Alabama. However, even more, he loved being a servant of God leading as many people to Christ as he possibly could. Jon was a deep man of prayer and worked tirelessly to build strong marriages in his marriage seminars. Jon touched many lives as a coach, preacher, teacher, mentor, leader, husband, father, grandfather, servant and friend.

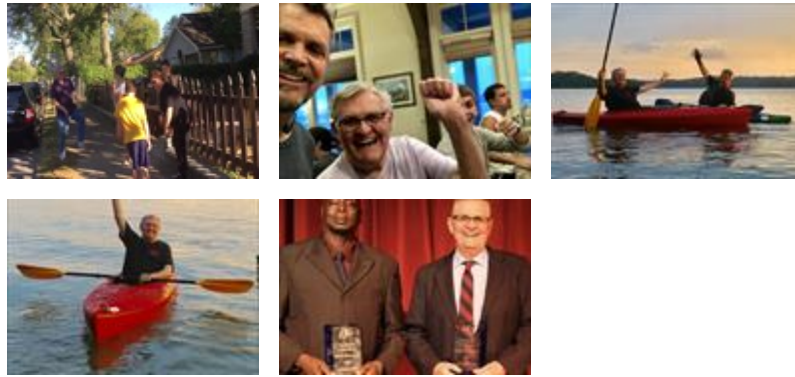
