December 6, 1931 - November 7, 2014

Margaret Ann Miller of Brentwood, TN passed away peacefully in her home Friday surrounded by family.

She was born in Speed, Kansas on December 6th, 1931 and from there experienced a remarkable life.

From a young age she took great interest in politics, a subject matter she believed deeply in and that would become a life-long passion. Her campaigning involvement began as a student – serving as coordinator for the Congressman Bill Avery campaign. It was during these early efforts that a spark was kindled to serve for the greater good. This calling to service would carry on throughout her life not only professionally but most importantly personally.

As the matriarch of a military family she devoted the majority of her life to raising 5 children – two daughters and three sons. Always ready for a new adventure, she served as a rock for her family while building homes in Kansas, Texas, Oklahoma, Hawaii, Virginia, and Tennessee.

After raising her family, she renewed her involvement in politics. For twenty-three years she served with distinction as the Executive Director of the Williamson County Republican Party. In this role she proved to be a valued resource to all Republican candidates in Williamson County. She was well known for her steadfast patience and strength in counseling both candidates and elected officials.

During her charge she was instrumental in: establishing a permanent office;

establishing the Chairman's Circle membership to garner major funds for Republican candidates; establishing the Williamson County Just Deserts annual fundraiser; managing correspondence for the Hilleary for Governor campaign, the Blackburn for Congress campaign, the Bryson for State Senate campaign, the Casada for State Representative campaign, and the Johnson for State Representative campaign. She took great joy in seeing these efforts, and many others over the years, contribute to the growth of membership in the Williamson County Republican Party by nearly 1000%.

In addition to her daily endeavors she proudly served as President of the Republican Women of Williamson County as well as a State Executive Committeewoman. In 2001, she was honored by the Tennessee Republican Party with the Statesman of the Year award.

She was preceded in death by her mother Margaret Rose McMullen and father Francis Leo McMullen.

She is survived by her children Debra Blackmon (Michael) of Kissimmee, FL, George M. Miller II (Dana) of Nashville, TN, Elizabeth Alexander (Mike) of Franklin TN, Jeffery Miller (Diane) of Franklin TN, Christopher Miller (Alison) of Charleston, SC, 9 grandchildren and 4 great-grandchildren.

Visitation will be held on Tuesday November 11th from 9-11 a.m. at Brentwood Methodist Church with a memorial service to follow at 11 a.m.
