SCHAUMAN, Norman Samuel passed away November 7, 2010. Born to the late Samuel and Hermina Schauman on November 29, 1912 in St. Louis, Missouri. Mr. Schauman was a deacon at the Third Baptist Church in St. Louis, Missouri, Woodmont Baptist Church in Nashville, Tennessee and Central Baptist Church in Knoxville, Tennessee and sang in the choir for over 50 years. He was very proud of his 8 years of teaching Bible Study at the Tennessee State Penitentiary and helping parolees find jobs. Mr. Schauman worked for Carter Carburetor in St. Louis and taught Adult Education classes at St. Louis University before moving to Nashville to work for Aladdin Industry as Chief Plant Engineer. In 1956, the American Society of Tool Engineers elected him "Man of the Year". He moved to Knoxville to work for Cardinal Machinery and retired from the company when he was 70. He was a 32nd Degree Mason and a 50 year member of the John B. Garrett

Lodge in Nashville and a member of the Society of Manufacturing Engineers. Mr. Schauman will be laid to rest on Friday, November 12, 2010, in the St. Peter's Cemetery in St. Louis, Missouri at 2:30PM.
