



## Stephen Roger Hough

May 4, 1943 - October 17, 2023

Stephen Roger Hough of Nashville, 80, passed away Tuesday, October 17, 2023. He was born May 4, 1943 in Falls Church, VA and earned a civil engineering degree in 1965 at Virginia Technological University before relocating to Nashville.

Steve is survived by his loving wife, Jackie Fuller Hough, daughters Stephanie (Troy) McClendon of Hendersonville, and Kristin (Michael) Wayda of Shreveport, LA, son Stephen (Lesa) of Park City, UT and eight wonderful grandchildren.

Steve continued his business career in Nashville with IBM for 14 years followed by three years at Pearl Equipment. He was cofounder of ASCDI in the late 70s before founding Computer Marketing America and finishing with Tennecom and Tennecom Gaming. Steve possessed keen business skills and acumen which guided his career.

A longtime member of The Golf Club of TN and Kiwanis Club of Nashville, Steve always maintained a true love for golf and benefiting others in his path. He consistently supported Middle TN Boy Scouts of America, his favorite charitable organization. Annually Steve volunteered at the TN Special Olympics with Kiwanis. Aside from his family, his crowning achievement was personally mentoring for a decade the lives of Jarad and Jared McCray, two gifted but underprivileged student athletes who were standouts in football. Jackie and Steve successfully supported and encouraged the twins through both Cane Ridge High School and Murray State University, at which they both

earned athletic scholarships and graduated. It was not uncommon for Steve to emphasize to these young men as well as his children and grandchildren the importance of manners, integrity, forgiveness, perseverance, responsibility and first impressions.

Steve shared his caring, sharing and friendly nature freely throughout his life and impacted others in positive fashion. His children fondly recall his dry wit and fun nature, his love of sports, travel, hydroponic gardening and woodworking coupled with his genuine concern for others. Steve will be fondly and warmly remembered as a man of kindness, patience and thoughtfulness as he freely shared his talents, insights and treasures with both family and friends.
