Ursula Gerda Haude started her journey through life on March 16, 1929 in Berlin Germany. She was born as the first and only child to Felix and Margarete Schreiber. Her father was a railway man and her mother was a factory worker and home maker. Her father's job allowed the family to travel in pre-World War II Germany. Those family travels instilled in her an inquisitive mind and a lifelong love of travel. She survived the horrors of World War II and the Berlin Blockade.

She moved to Cologne, Germany in 1954, when she married Juergen Walter Haude. He predeceased her on May 12, 1996 and was the love of her life. Convinced that she met her personal guardian angel in early mid-life, she was ready to be reunited with Juergen in heaven as her earthly journey came to a close. She will be buried by his side in Cologne.

She had a rewarding career at Ford Credit Bank in Germany; was an accomplished needle point artist; and took up painting after moving to Tennessee in 2010. She and her almost perpetual smile will be remembered as a gracious, always elegant, loving and non-judgmental woman with a zest for life.
